3.	<p>MINUTES OF THE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING OF 20TH DECEMBER 2016: The minutes were agreed and will be signed as a true record with the following amendments: Stephen Monday not Mumby “Cllr Roberts felt pressured on the day to accept a Foxton speculative application and has since written to SCDC CEO expressing concern.”</p>	
4.	<p>MATTERS ARISING: SCDC - Community Award. Pat Rowley has been nominated previously and a name has been suggested to be put forward – Clerk to progress.</p>	Clerk
5.	<p>COUNTY COUNCIL AFFAIRS:</p> <p>Cllr Topping was unable to attend the meeting but sent in the following report:</p> <p><u>“County and district wide</u> <i>This week sees the start of work on the Ely bypass. Why does this matter to us? It is the sort of big infrastructure work that will help move people round the county more easily and could reduce the pressure on South Cambs to build more houses. Under the Cambridgeshire Devolution proposals I am seeking to have improvements to the A505 included in our Devolution II bid to central government in 2017. This is long term, but it will be a start. I had a meeting with civil servants this week to discuss further.</i></p> <p><i>I attended the Health Committee where we were looking at the Sustainability & Transformation Plan being put together by the health commissioning group. Savings of between 10-12% need to be achieved over the next 5 years, and the committee’s role is to scrutinize this work on behalf of residents who access health services. The Chief Exec of Addenbrookes attended and we asked him about how the hospital is improving since being put in special measures 18 months ago.</i></p> <p><i>The Full County Council meeting in December agreed to reverse the decision to reduce gritting routes. This was universally welcomed. The original gritting cuts were part of a package of measures to save money, and avoid putting up the county precept. But clearly the gritting work is a key frontline service. All routes have been reinstated and there are sufficient crews to grit as required.</i></p> <p><i>The county council has to spend a lot of money on adult social care. In the next budget in February, there will be difficult choices between putting up the precept to pay for adult social care, or cutting</i></p>	

	<p><i>back on other services to keep the increase as low as possible. There is a survey of Adult Carers being carried out by the county to better understand what support those people need in their role.</i></p> <p><u>Devolution update</u> <i>I am leading the work to accelerate building affordable houses across the county, especially in South Cambs. These are on sites that already have been assigned, so this isn't about building on new land. We are also trying to find ways of encouraging self-build houses.</i></p> <p><u>City Deal</u> <i>The City Deal has been urged to consider introducing a congestion charge on people driving into Cambridge at peak times. I oppose this because I see it as an unfair tax on residents of South Cambridgeshire whose work takes them into the City. The public transport systems need to be improved first before this could be considered. I am though in favour of an emissions charge on high-polluting vehicles in the historic centre of the City, and places like Addenbrookes which has surprisingly high pollution levels.</i></p> <p><u>Closer to home</u> <i>I continue to chase the county on the work still to be done on the flytipping area. The last rather sad looking caravan has gone from the collection of nine that were on Thriplow heath before Christmas – the district planning enforcement team visited several times – this is the land on which there is an injunction to make it easier to move trespassers on.</i></p> <p>A) SPEEDWATCH / CCC BID The date has been agreed for the panel interview for Cllr Howe and Cllr Wragg. Clerk to initiate the date with the local PCSO for Speedwatch Training. Cllr Topping to advise on obtaining a Speedwatch camera / Clerk to also ask local Speedwatch connection. Is it possible that “no access to.....” signs can be put up – Highways could advise on the possibilities. Barley and Barkway now have the speed signs with smiles/actual speed.</p> <p>B) CLEARANCE OF CCC LAND NEAR SCHOOL CAR PARK Nothing further has happened on this – Clerk to chase Cllr Topping.</p>	<p>Clerk Cllr Topping</p> <p>Clerk</p>

The longer it is delayed, the more speculative applications can be submitted. Welding Alloys has still not been decided at SCDC. There is a local speculative application in Thriplow on the present grain store (35 houses), with a meeting on 26th January at Thriplow Village Hall – Cllr Roberts/Cllr Bearpark to attend (it was rejected in the original ‘call for sites’ and Thriplow is probably an ‘infill’ village not a ‘group’ village.) 1. Declarations of interest (*if any*)

Cllr Roberts declared that if an application is later placed before South Cambridgeshire District Council she will approach any new information afresh. Also, because Cllr Roberts is a District Cllr at SCDC, the same applies and she will look at any application, which goes to SCDC, afresh.

Cllr Bearpark declared an interest in item 5 as he is a resident and he will be leaving the room.

2. S/3285/16/FL

Detached double garage

Oak Lodge, Long Lane, Fowlmere, SG8 7TG

Fowlmere Parish Council recommends approval as it lies within the village envelope and is a simple, almost agricultural structure, which marries in with the rest of the buildings in the vicinity.

Mr Mill explained that he has had 4 separate planning officers at SCDC dealing with his application and it has been suggested that all buildings are in 'one' building rather than an outbuilding being part of the design. He feels the land warrants a better property than the previous permission allowed.

Cllr Roberts asked what consideration has been made for the neighbours?

Mr Mulholland was speaking for 80, 82, 84, 86 Chapel Lane – he is disappointed with the design – it's much bigger (330sqm?). There are still height issues, the proximity issues have returned in this application too. It's disappointed to have to go through this process again.

Mr Forbes is at number 39 Chapel Lane and, whilst not being in principle against a development on the site (to which Mr Mulholland agreed), has issues with soakaways and access. The existing access is in place to service the site, not the actual dwelling and there are issues with the angle onto the road and the scale and nature of the entrance gates are questionable. Mr Mill says Highways and Planning are happy with the access design.

Cllr Roberts read out the original refusal from July 2012.

The original reasons for refusal still stand. It is a restricted site, in greenbelt land and permission has already been given for a smaller bungalow. The Clerk to prepare a response to circulate to Cllrs, using details from the previous refusal and point SCDC officers to look at their previous refusal dated

13th July 2012 (ref S/0594/12/FL), including concerns about the access. If the officers have a different view from FPC then we must insist that this goes to the Planning Committee.

Fowlmere Parish Council (FPC) feels that this proposal should be viewed as a proper planning application, not through the process of a certificate of lawful development. This would mean that residents on site would be given a chance to have a voice. This is a doubling up of the number of dwellings on the site, it is outside of the village envelope and FPC is very concerned that the proposal is being conducted in this manner. There are issues about the scale of the development and again, FPC strongly questions the seemingly temporary use of touring caravans being used to add substance and whilst not challenging the evidence, FPC insists that this needs to be a consistent application which is open to consultation with the various parties involved.

Fowlmere Parish Council recommends approval because it clearly differentiates the old from the new, whilst providing some extra space for the applicants.

Change of use of building previously used as part of a farm office to A1 use, to be used as a hairdressing salon. Internal works to include provision of water points for hair washing, no external alterations proposed.

This type of service business should be situated within village envelopes and it is entirely inappropriate and against policies to approve such in the open countryside where change of use is restricted. There appears to be no business plan shown and this is clearly in planning terms not acceptable farm diversification, nor is it indeed claimed as such.

This application site forms part of a group of farm buildings and should this application be approved it could set a precedent for further expansion. The application simply seeks to change the farm use to

one of unfettered commercial development which should be strongly resisted as inappropriate in the rural setting.

Fowlmere Parish Council therefore recommends refusal.

Should the officers view differ from that of the PC then it requests that the application goes to SCDC Planning Committee, following a site visit.

A vote was taken 4 support a refusal and 3 abstained.
