2.	<p>DECLARATION OF INTEREST IN AGENDA ITEMS: No items were declared.</p>

4.	<p>MINUTES OF THE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING OF 14TH DECEMBER 2010: The minutes were agreed and signed as a true record.</p>

6.	<p>UPDATE ON THE VILLAGE HALL:</p> <p>a) Village Hall Representative</p> <p>Cllr Roberts thanked Mrs Tamsin Goodfellow, Chairman of the Village Hall, for coming to the PC meeting in order to update the Parish Council on progress. Mrs Goodfellow reported that the fundraising for the VH has been fantastic and bookings are up. The Farmer's Markets have been very successful too and are increasing footfall. The price review probably won't result in too much of an increase as they have to remain competitive. Cllr Bates is putting in a bid to Awards for All for a new boiler (2 years have elapsed since the last application so they can now apply again – it has to be less than £25,000). There is a wish list and other potential sources of money (including possible funding from SCDC), so this is being worked upon. The Village Hall would also look to the Parish Council for any donations</p> <p>Cllr Wragg asked if 'Warm Front' could be a source of money but Cllr Webb advised that this would not be the case as only applies to domestic properties.</p> <p>Cllr Roberts asked if Mrs Goodfellow had confidence that the fundraising could continue as such a great momentum. Mrs Goodfellow said she has challenged the committee, asking that question and she has every confidence in their continuing. It also helps that the fundraising team are a different group of people than that on the VH Management Team and the village should be very grateful to their continuing fundraising efforts.</p> <p>Cllr Roberts advised Mrs Goodfellow that the PC has submitted their precept request and there is some money built in for potential support for the Village Hall. The PC should be able to help on a smaller project, for example towards</p>	

	<p>the insulation. The PC would need a proper tendering process and is also aware that an amount of money could be used to attract further funding within a bid for something else if necessary.</p> <p>Cllr Bates said the VH will need to wait for the go-ahead from any grants etc before commencing a project to avoid any problems..</p> <p>Cllr Roberts thanked Mrs Goodfellow for coming along.</p> <p>Cllr Bates proposed Cllr Wragg as the representative from the PC on the VH committee. Cllr Roberts seconded. There were no further nominations and Cllr Wragg was duly elected. Cllr Wragg would be happy to be appointed until the next PC election in the first instance.</p>

The Parish Council feel the approach is wholly inappropriate because the site is outside of the village envelope and outside of SCDC current planning policy. The Clerk to draft a response to clear with the Councillors before sending.</p> <p>Regarding the Thriplow Triangle development, the PC have heard verbally that the planning fee has now been paid and the application submitted to SCDC. 8.	<p>BURIAL BOARD: The Clerk read out a letter of complaint from Mrs Iverna Moss concerning a memorial stone in the Cemetery. The Council agreed that it may not be to everyone's taste but we have to respect everyone's wishes and assess each application individually, trying to accommodate individual grief. It looks quite 'new' at present but it will weather. The PC were not forced to make a quick decision and were never under any pressure from the widow concerned. The Clerk to thank Mrs Moss for her letter and explain that the PC aim to be open-minded and unbiased, to allow individual families to have what they feel happy with, within reason.</p>	Clerk

9.	TREES, GRASS AND HEDGES: Cllr Bates updated the PC on the Round Moat. He met with Natural England and English Heritage and went through the possibilities regarding finance. On the edge of the moat there is a small triangle of land which has had to be revised on the maps, once this has been sorted out, Cllr Bates will be sent revised application papers although he has been advised the PC are unlikely to receive any funding in the present financial year. The PC should be in with a fair chance of obtaining finance within the next financial year though. Cllr Roberts thanked Cllr Bates for his continuing efforts with this ongoing project.	
10.	FINANCE AND GENERAL PURPOSES: Following the earlier Finance Meeting, there was nothing additional for this meeting.	
11.	CORRESPONDENCE: The Clerk reported an e-mail from the residents at Perks Close, Chapel Lane, regarding building a second property in their garden, seeking advice from the PC as to design etc. The PC should not take part in any such discussions and Mrs Mackenzie should speak to the Planning Officers at SCDC, especially considering the house is listed and has a protected frontage. SCDC can also advise accurately on the policies connected with the dwelling of that age and type and also its curtilage, which has certain protections. OTHER MATTERS: The Clerk to speak to SCDC again about the mis-timed school signs Cllr Bates requested shovels for the salt bins but it was suggested that they would be stolen so the PC would not progress their purchase. It was noted that some salt bins need refilling so the Clerk to request that with CCC Highways. Cllr Bates reported that he had had a complaint from a resident in Westfield Road that other Westfield Road residents are using the school car park on Top Close for parking overnight, which is on County Council land and someone has removed some overgrown tree branches that ought not to have been removed. He will mention this to Cllr Stone although it would appear that nothing need to be done regarding the parking as there have been no complaints from the school.
